Potpourri

The ole pipeliner couldn't help blubbering when seated next to Malcolm Kilduff at a recent dinner. Kilduff is assistant press secretary at the White House and the guy who first tolled the gloomy announcement over the loudspeakers, "President John F. Kennedy has died..."

And there was Malcolm Kilduff, the press secretary who accompanied the late President Kennedy on the fatal trip, sitting next to us. He was at the Detroit Press Club to speak to a joint meeting of Theta Sigma Phi and Sigma Delta Chi, journalistic ladies and gentlemen respectively. And we gushed over the fruit cocktail, "To think that here I am, sitting next to the man who broke my heart!"

WHEN WILLIAM Manchester writes the book Jacqueline Kennedy selected him last week to prepare, Kilduff undoubtedly will contribute his story to it. The book will cover the events that took place in the six days from Nov. 20 through Nov. 25.

Kilduff says he got up about 7 a.m. Friday, Nov. 22, and did not sleep again until the following Monday. He was riding in the second car behind the President when the shots came. The first one was a firecracker, he thought.

"With the second and third shots, I knew what it was," he recalls. "I could see the Secret Service man running to Mrs. Kennedy, and I saw the Secret Service man in the car just ahead shielding the Vice President."

"I THOUGHT someone might have shot Mrs. Connally, or that maybe a Secret Service man had been hit. I didn't realize it was the President until we got to the hospital and I got up to the car and saw him lying there. "Medically," he said, "there was a faint trace of a heart-beat, but actually, he was gone."

He discussed with Vice President Johnson the advisability of making the announcement. Since they did not know that it was not a conspiracy, they delayed the announcement for 12 minutes to protect the Vice President.

"Then I made the announcement," he said. "I left the hospital with Mrs. Kennedy and the body of the late President."

KILDUFF IS A stocky, young-looking chain smoker who takes a benzedrine-type pill he calls a "greenie" to keep going without sleep when things are rough.

He started his government service with the State Department. Responsible for the State Department's press liaison with the White House, he impressed Pierre Salinger as a capable press relations man. It was Salinger who hired him for the White House's three-man press staff.

They work in a small office directly across the hall from the President. When "Mac" Kilduff started work there, John F. Kennedy had trouble remembering his name. Kennedy once told an aide, "Send in that MacDuff."

AS THE MAN who helps supervise the staging of a presidential press conference, Kilduff claims, "A President just plain doesn't need all this back preparation for a press conference that stories indicate."

At every press conference, he contends, they are surprised that certain questions they expect are not asked. LBJ reads a great many newspapers, as JFK did, says Kilduff.

"If you ever got a call early in the morning wondering about an article in some obscure newspaper you never read, you would know what I mean!"

When Kilduff got up to speak that night, it was just two hours after the announcement that Salinger was resigning.

"I HAD A LOT of notes here," began Kilduff, "about what it's like to work for Pierre Salinger."

Then he crumpled up the paper in front of him and threw it toward the floor.

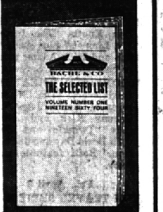
