TO TOUR EUROPE B'ham YMCA Plan 4 Summer Teen Trips

Four separate summer programs for teens are being offered to area youngsters by the YMCA.

The first is a caravan trip for girls and boys 14 to 18 years of age which will take them on a 32-day trip through the eastern United States and Canada.

They will travel in five new station wagons donated by the Chrysler Corporation, through Alan G. Loofbarrow of Bloomfield Hills, to such places as the New York World's Fair, Cape Cod, Bar Harbor, Quebec, Montreal and Ottawa.

THE TRIP through New England will include a four-day canoe trip, a stop at Lake Winnepesaukee and Mt. Washington, N. H., and Mt. Kathdin, Me., under the leadership of Mr. and Mrs. Dick Jencks.

Two complete trips, both co-educational, have been scheduled and enrollment will be limited to 30 campers per trip.

The other programs are for teen boys only. One is a Canadian trip for 14 to 16-year-olds and will include two weeks in the Canadian wilderness as well as two weeks at Camp Nisakone, near Osooda.

Special Season Set for Archers, Spear Fishermen

Archers and spear fishermen are now able to take aim on rough fish in streams of 67 Lower Peninsula counties which have been singled out by the Conservation Department.

Starting yesterday sportsmen may take carp, suckers, rockhopper, mullet, dogfish and garpike in this part of the state. Only Osage county is not included under the Lower Peninsula's special season which continues through May 31.

UPPER PENINSULA bowmen and spear enthusiasts will be on the firing line for these same fish throughout May in designated streams of all counties except Ontonagon.

Use of artificial lights will be optional in most waters. For free lists of the streams, write the Conservation Department's Publications Room in Lansing or contact any of its field offices.
