The frame house was later replaced in 1871 by the second First Methodist Church in Birmingham (right), located on the corner of Maple and Henrietta. Sunday, First Methodist will dedicate its present church (lower left), built in 1952. The total debt on the church property has been retired and the burning of the loan agreement at the three regular Sunday services will signify the dedication of the debt-free church.
