Township Gets Detroit Water

When Bloomfield Township sewer and water department official Jim Scott plays host tonight to a meeting of the Southern Michigan Water and Sewer Utilities Association, he will have a real reason to celebrate.

Scott's efforts to bring Detroit City water to the township have culminated this week. All 3,000 township residents presently served by Bloomfield's water department were tied into the Detroit system during the week.

Scott advised that residents continue to use their water softeners for the next two weeks until his department can finish flushing out mineral deposits which have accumulated in the mains during the years well water was pumped through them.

Scott, who is secretary of the utility association, has planned a dinner meeting tonight at Devon Gables. Members of the township board are specially invited guests.

Do you realize that if Adlai Stevenson had his way, the United States would give up its sovereignty and become a part of a "World Government"? U. Thant, secretary-general of the United Nations, joins Stevenson in that conviction.

"If the United States does not press on in support of world policing and world law," declares Stevenson, "the world, I believe without rhetoric or exaggeration, is lost." He, like many others, wants a "One-World Government" . . . in spite of the fact that the U. N. itself has proved that its members will not unite on various problems, including financial support for that organization. (It's so easy to theorize, on paper; but when it comes to realistic decisions, history proves again and again that "nationalism" still dominates the thoughts of most people . . . Stevenson and his kind to the contrary notwithstanding.)
