

Council OK's Water, Sewer Ordinances

Lathrup Village's long-discussed sanitary sewer disposal charge ordinance and water regulations ordinance were approved at the city council meeting Monday night. The ordinance established rules for operation, maintenance, charges and penalties. The sewer disposal charge is set at 82 cents per 1000 feet of water, with \$3.50 set as maximum. A charge of 10 cents will be added if paid after the due date. Both ordinances will go into effect on May 1.

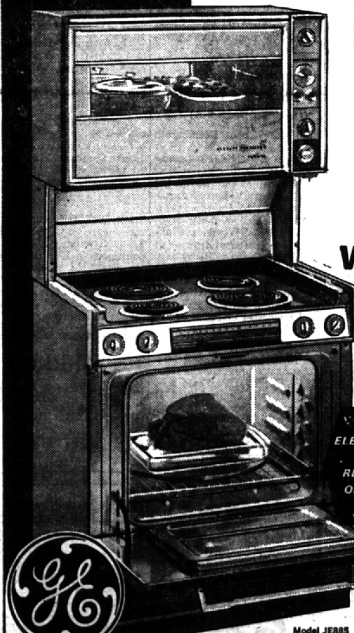
