Area Men Attend Religious Conference in Cincinnati

ON A high cliff overlooking a bend in the Ohio River, 60 business and professional men sat eating box lunches at picnic tables. The time: noon. The day: Wednesday, April Fool's Day.

The occasion: another phase of a fast-paced conference on "Christian Laymen in Urban Structures," held March 31-April 3 in Cincinnati by the Division of Evangelism, American Baptist Convention.

These men from ten states had been invited to the conference in an attempt to find out where and how the Christian faith fits in today's world.

Attending from the Birmingham area were Frank E. Pusey, of Birmingham; Dr. Selwyn Smith and Robert M. Boltwood, both of Southfield; and Glenn A. Mann, of Royal Oak.

EACH DAY of the conference, the group dug deep into their life experiences and thought processes to learn how the Christian layman confronts everyday existence. They used lectures, total-group discussions, workshops, field trips and far-into-the-night sessions in hotel rooms.

They heard talks by a psychiatrist from the National Institute of Health, the Jewish director of the Contemporary Art Center in Cincinnati, an Old Testament scholar from Vanderbilt University, and the Jewish director of Human Relations of the Family Service Association of Cincinnati.

At the opening luncheon the Honorable Walton Bachrach, mayor of Cincinnati and president of the city council, welcomed the group, traced the city's growth, and commented on plans for the future.

Field trips by bus gave added meaning to discussions. The group went to the Cincinnati city hall for an illustrated talk on urban planning. Next was a visit to the integrated College Hill Christian (Disciples of Christ) Church.

There a panel of Catholic, Presbyterian, Episcopal and Disciples of Christ ministers and laymen explained how they had formed a council to handle community problems of a social and religious nature. They also told how they had achieved racial harmony.
