At the meeting and to answer questions on hair styling and hair problems was one of the operators from the salon.

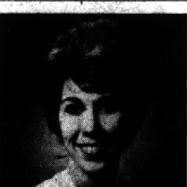

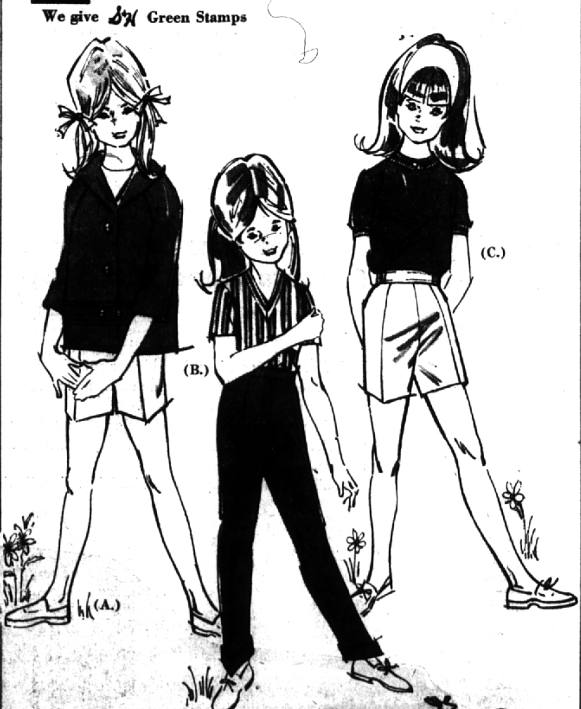
