WEST (Dealer) EAST

SOUTH (Mickie Bush)
♠ A K J 10
♥ 8 6 4 3
♦ A 7 4

The bidding:
WEST NORTH EAST SOUTH
pass pass 1 Δ 1 NT
pass pass 2 ♣ pass
2 Δ 2 NT all pass

Opening lead: 3♣
Mickie won the first trick by overtaking East's nine of spades with her 10. She now led the eight of hearts, which was covered by West's 10 of hearts, and here is where Mickie made a winning play by playing the deuce from the board.

After East won this trick with the jack, he returned the deuce of spades and Mickie played the jack which held this trick.

The fourth trick was again a heart, and again Mickie ducked from the board and East won the trick with the ace. She now played the third heart and won in the dummy and returned the 10 of clubs, East covered with the jack, and Mickie's king was the winner. She now forced the ace of clubs and returned to dummy with a heart to make four no-trump for the top board.
