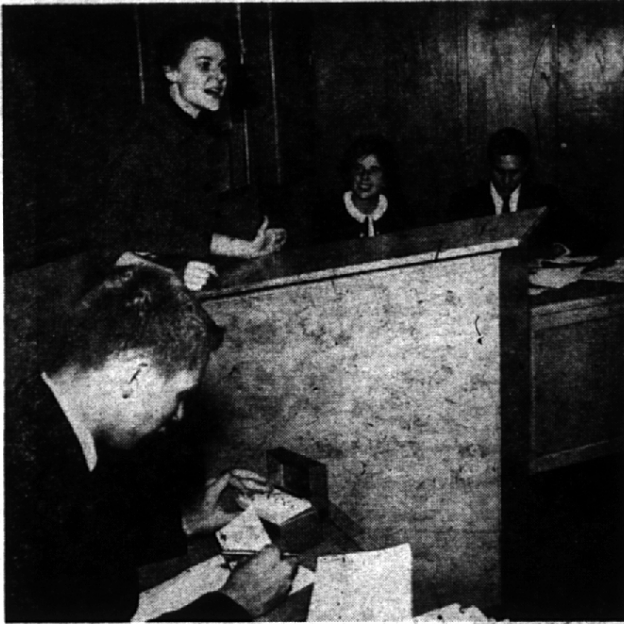


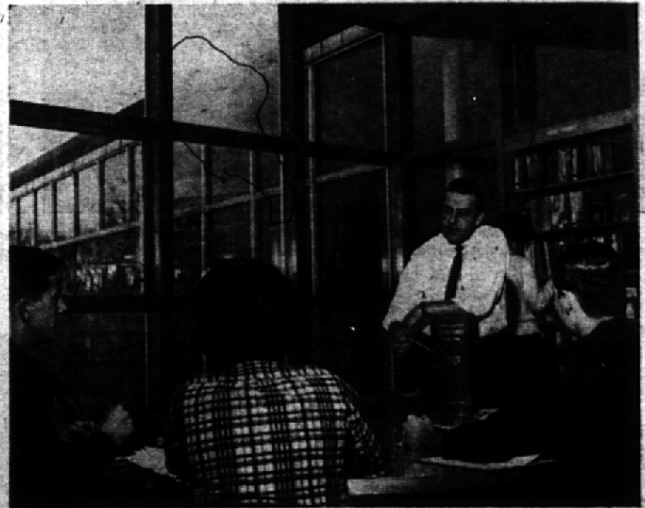
Goal No. 4 . . .

To encourage the development and use of creative thought and the ability to reason.

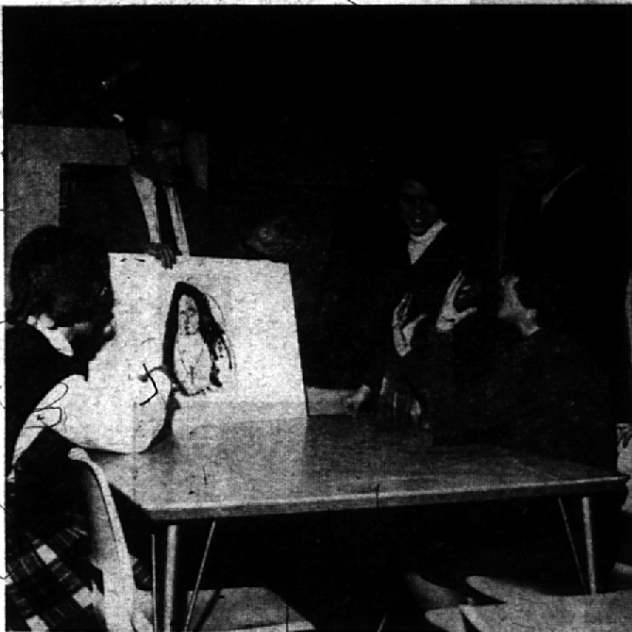

This goal is as applicable to the instruction carried on in art, music and metal working classrooms, as it is to the instruction in the elementary classroom or the English and social studies classrooms of the secondary schools. Wherever instruction is carried on, the master teacher introduces concepts to be learned as problems to be solved—the concepts emerge as the product of the student's ability to reason.
