# 45 Year-Round Students At OU Granted Degrees

Degrees of honor were awarded to 23 of the 225 students who received diplomas today at Oakland University's second formal commencement.

Another distinguished group among the graduates were 45 students who are the first to earn their bachelor's degrees in two and two-thirds years (instead of the normal four) in Oakland's year-round program, which it adopted in the fall of 1961.

A top honor went to Jacqueline Sheehan, of Rochester, who graduated summa cum laude. Miss Sheehan is a major in modern languages, earning her degree in two and two-thirds years.

**BIRMINGHAM ART** major Charles E. Brownell and Dolores G. Golemyer, of Berkeley, who is in business administration, earned cum laude honors.

Following the program, the Friends of Oakland (a parents' organization) gave a reception for the graduates, their parents and guests in the Oakland Student Center. Mrs. James Cameron, of Birmingham, was chairman of the reception committee.

D. B. Varner, chancellor of the University, introduced the principal speaker Dr. Logan Wilson,

president of the American Council on Education, Washington, D. C., and an educator for more than 35 years, who told the graduates they were fortunate to be associated with a young institution which has not yet had time to become entrenched in traditions and rigid in its approaches to problems of higher education.

Honorary doctor of laws degrees were presented to Dr. Wilson and Stanley S. Kresge, president of the Kresge Foundation and vice chairman of the S. S. Kresge Company board of directors.

OAKLAND University has received two grants worth \$1,576,000 from the Kresge Foundation—\$1.5 million for the library building and \$76,000 for construction of a music pavilion for the Meadow Brook Music Festival which will be held this year from July 23 through Aug. 15.

# Court Decision Voids Portion Of Pool Law

LATHRUP—A provision of the city's swimming pool ordinance requiring the consent of 70 per cent of neighboring property owners before a pool can be built has been declared unconstitutional in Oakland County Circuit Court.

Judge William J. Beer ruled Friday that it is not necessary to get permission of property owners within 200 feet before building a pool. The judge personally inspected the neighborhood in which Elouis and Elizabeth Harp, 18730 Saratoga, want to build a pool.

Harp's attorney, Philip R. Hofus of Detroit, said the requirement was another "chipping away" at personal liberties if neighbors are allowed to legislate the use of a person's property.

ABOUT SIX weeks ago, Judge Beer told the city to rewrite the law and issue Harp a building permit for the pool but the council decided the 70 per cent provision should be tested in court.

Beer ordered Lathrup to issue the building permit after ruling the section unconstitutional.

The suit was filed nearly a year ago after the Harps had been turned down twice by the city board of zoning appeals because they did not have the required 70 per cent of neighbor approval.


