Students are wondering if "that" picture will appear in print and if "that" scream will be heard on the accompanying record.

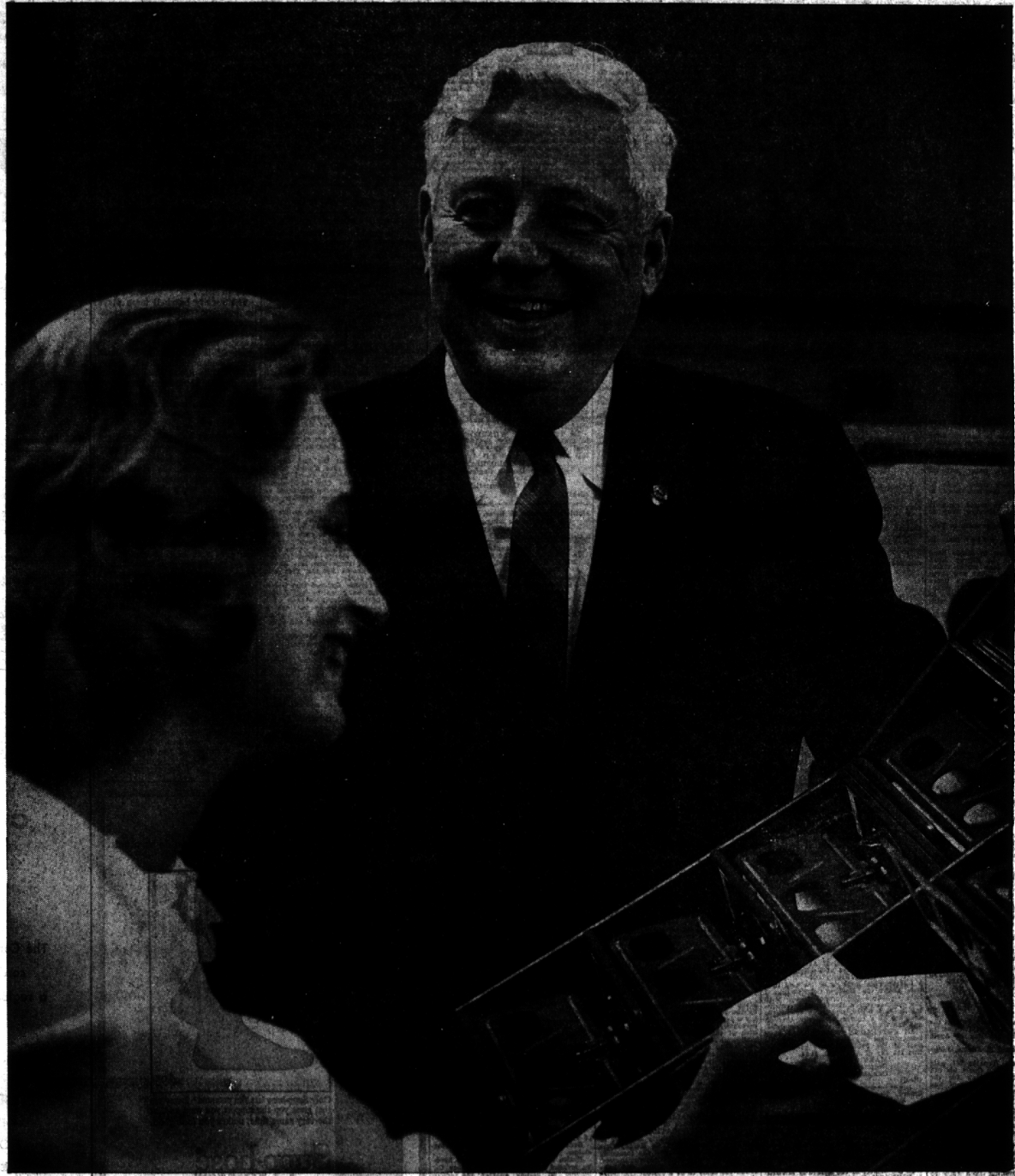
