



First Baptist Lists Four Sermon Topics

Dr. Homer J. Armstrong, pastor of Birmingham's First Baptist Church, likes to get at the roots of a question.

Empty pleasures do not satisfy him. Recently, he has been pondering the motives that made Jesus what he was, what he did, what he said.

The result is a series of Sunday sermons on the motives of Jesus. Dr. Armstrong has found in the Gospels four basic motives that he will attempt to relate to the modern world.

"DON'T ASK Them — Tell Them" is the topic for the first sermon, April 26. How did Jesus teach people? Can we use his method today, or have times changed? How do we reach people?

On May 3, Dr. Armstrong will consider "God's in His Heaven—A Man's on the Earth," a change from Robert Browning's famous inspirational lines. What was Christ's belief in God? Do we today prefer to keep God in his heaven, safely out of our way?

"Do We Need People?" is the sermon topic for Sunday, May 10. Is another way to ask the question, "Is increasingly common question, 'Is modern man becoming obsolete?'"
