Fashion Preview, Card Party Aid Providence Hosp.

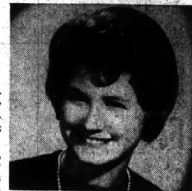
The ninth annual spring luncheon and card party sponsored by the auxiliary of Providence Hospital is scheduled for April 29 at the Detroit Golf Club.
