

Duo-Pianists Will Perform Light Classics

Duo-pianists Norman Gifford and Sally Dow will present a Concert program of light classics at Highland Park College at 2 p.m. Wednesday. The concert is open to the public without charge. Both are teachers at the Birmingham Conservatory of Music. Miss Dow, a Birmingham resident, teaches piano; Gifford who lives in Ferndale, teaches flute and piano.

GIFFORD AND DOW have been concertizing as a piano team for the last seven years. Their performances include concerts in the Detroit Institute of Arts, Oakland University and various colleges in Michigan. An extensive repertoire, ranging from rare old manuscripts to compositions published as recently as the present year, distinguishes their programs. They have made a speciality of playing musical works by contemporary British composers and have been invited to England to record some of their music.

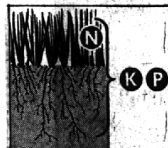
The Sorbonne, one of the colleges of Paris, was founded in 1250 by Robert de Sorbon, Chaplain of Louis IX. It was originally a theological college.

Blind Student and Muggsy Spanier 'Jam' Together

Andy Moses, 19-year-old freshman from Oakland University who has been blind since birth, had the thrill of a lifetime recently when he stepped to the bandstand with his clarinet and "jammed" with Muggsy Spanier, one of the country's foremost Dixieland artists.

The two played before more than 100 of Detroit's press corps at a party celebrating the opening of the Showboat, new downtown night club.

Young Moses has been playing the clarinet since he was nine years old and is a long-time fan of Spanier's. Andy has spent hundreds of hours in his home playing along with his Spanier records, interpreting the music in his own way.

NEVER HAVING seen a note, Moses' music comes from an almost encyclopedic memory and, in Spanier's words, "his soul." Spanier said that in a couple of years' young Moses could be a great musician.

Andy is the only blind person to be graduated from Bloomfield Hills High School.

His textbooks were taped by his mother and father, and Andy played them back to study his assignments. Some of the material was available in braille.

He received a standing ovation from his fellow graduates and the audience when he received his diploma last summer.

Spanier and Moses talked Dixieland jazz like two old pros. Andy can go to his library of more than 5,000 records and locate any one he wants just by feeling the album.
