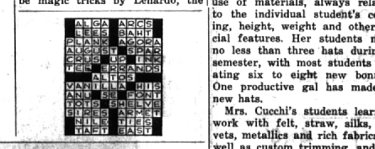

She instructs her students in simple upholstery, wood refinishing, antiquing, picture mounting and framing, wall hangings and remaking lamps. Mrs. Hague wants her students to experiment and bring out their individual creative abilities.

**MILLINERY** Mrs. Patricia Cuchi teaches the fundamentals of millinery, blocking, designing and use of materials, always relative to the individual student's coloring, height, weight and other special features. Her students make no less than three hats during a semester, with most students creating six to eight new bonnets. One productive girl has made 14 new hats. Mrs. Cuchi's students learn to work with felt, straw, silks, velvets, metallics and rich fabrics, as well as custom trimming, and her open house display will include examples of each of these.

**PAINTING — ADULTS AND CHILDREN** Mrs. Virginia Schaefer stresses the importance of originality while teaching the fundamentals of painting, drawing, form and balance, as well as art ethics. Her adult students use pastels, water colors and oils, and sometimes a combination of these.
