BEVERLY HILLS—A nine-year-old boy had both legs broken last Thursday when he was struck by a car on 13 Mile Road, west of Churchill Drive.

Wilfred Brunk, son of Dr. and Mrs. Perry E. Brunk, 11605 Ken-nedy Court, Beverly Hills, is in "good" condition at Mt. Carmel Mercy Hospital, Detroit.

Police said the accident occurred at 4:33 p.m. when Wilfred, riding his bicycle east on the north side of 13 Mile, swerved off the sidewalk into the path of a westbound car driven by Trudy Hinson, 22, of Royal Oak.

Schools Plan Centennial Art Show

Highlighting the Birmingham Public Schools' participation in the centennial observance will be an all-school student art show at Derby Junior High School from Friday, May 22, through Sunday, May 24.

On Friday, the exhibit will be open from 7 p.m. to 10 p.m. with students demonstrating their skill in their respective art fields from 7:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. Hours on Saturday will be from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. and on Sunday, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.

There will be about 1,500 art objects representing the work of students in each of the elementary and secondary schools.

FOR CENTENNIAL—Michigan Wesley May 17-23, classroom teachers will be planning exhibits and will show films and film strips featuring Michigan's history, resources, commerce and culture. Many students will have students participating in art, poetry and essay competition.

Michigan will display posters and Centennial-Michigan Week materials, fly the Michigan flag and plant the Michigan tree, the white pine. Schools will tie in activities and displays with the Birmingham centennial celebration.

Many children will visit local business and government officials' special exhibits and take trips to places of historical importance. High school students will again welcome the visiting mayor and present a key to the city.

Groves and Seaborn bands and "queens" will participate in the Centennial Day parade, Saturday, May 23. Floats from junior and senior high schools will participate in the parade.

ALTHOUGH ALL schools will highlight Michigan and especially the local centennial during the week, facts and information about Michigan are incorporated in the curriculum throughout the year.

commission. Commissioner Carl F. Ingraham was not present Monday night.

For the same reason, commissioners delayed taking action on a recommendation to rezone 14 parcels of land on the south side of Villa from Columbia to Eton. The plan board has recommended the land either be acquired for park purposes or rezoned from its present two-family to a multiple-family classification.

Property owners in the area are objecting to the multiple-family classification.

IN OTHER action, commissioners approved the rezoning of a group of lots along the north side of 14 mile between Stanley and Henrietta from multiple-family to single-family.

Brownfield said the properties are developed as a single-family along with most of the surrounding land both in Birmingham and in Beverly Hills.

He said the plan board felt the rezoning would stabilize the future maintenance and development of the property.

Lots fronting a six-block area along Eton between Hazel and Cole were rezoned from two-family to single-family. Brownfield said, and believing two-family structures are not in the best interests of the city the board felt the zoning should be changed.

A PLAN board recommendation that 13 lots along 14 Mile between Melton and Mansfield be rezoned from single-family to parking was approved to allow Our Shepherd Lutheran Church to construct additional parking facilities.

In the sixth hearing commissioners approved the rezoning of two lots in the Abbey and Winton area from multiple-family to single-family.

Although the lots were smaller than the minimum size permitted for single-family development, Brownfield said he felt the requirements could be relaxed through zoning board of appeals action.

He said the plan board felt the single-family classification would be more in character with surrounding properties.
