Three Groves students have recently been accepted for the National Science Foundation Summer Institute programs.

J. D. Bartleson, chemistry II student, has been selected to participate in the mathematics and biology program offered at Michigan State University. The institute begins June 21 and will end July 31.

George Klima, a chem study student, was selected to attend the physics program offered by Northern Michigan University in Marquette. The main part of this program will be the variety of physics lectures presented by noted physicists.

ROBERT DOBSON Jr., also a chem study student, was selected to participate in the mathematics program offered at Emory University in Atlanta, Georgia. Fifteen students were selected for this particular program which will begin June 15 and end July 17.

Dr. Bernard Weinstock, a research physicist, spoke to chemistry students on April 15. His lecture included a few of the many research projects with which he has been most successful. The next lecture will be given by Dr. Ober from Oakland University and will introduce the field of nuclear chemistry.

The science department is preparing for the open house which will be held in the Bowling at Groves from 7 p.m. 'til 9 p.m. on May 5.

Dave Torok, senior at Groves, was one of the five finalists in the Junior Achievement "President of the Year" contest. Finalists were rated on a five-minute speech on "Responsibility of a Corporation President", general appearance and the ability to field questions from the four judges.

Seaholm High School's full accreditation by the North Central Association of Secondary Schools and Colleges was continued at its annual meeting in Chicago on April 6-9, 1964. A total of 308 high schools are members of North Central Association, but only 87 of these schools received full accreditation at the annual meeting.

Seaholm High School has been continuously accredited by the North Central Association since 1912. Word of the action of the Review Committee at the annual meeting was received by Ross A. Wagner, principal, in a letter from Dr. G. Sutherland Hayden, Chairman of the Michigan North Central State Committee. Wagner was in attendance at the annual meeting in Chicago and served on the New Schools Committee.

A total of 87 new schools were admitted to membership in North Central at its annual meeting, thus bringing the total membership in the 19 north central states to 3,692.

used to increase the AFS Region Treasury to bring foreign students to the United States.

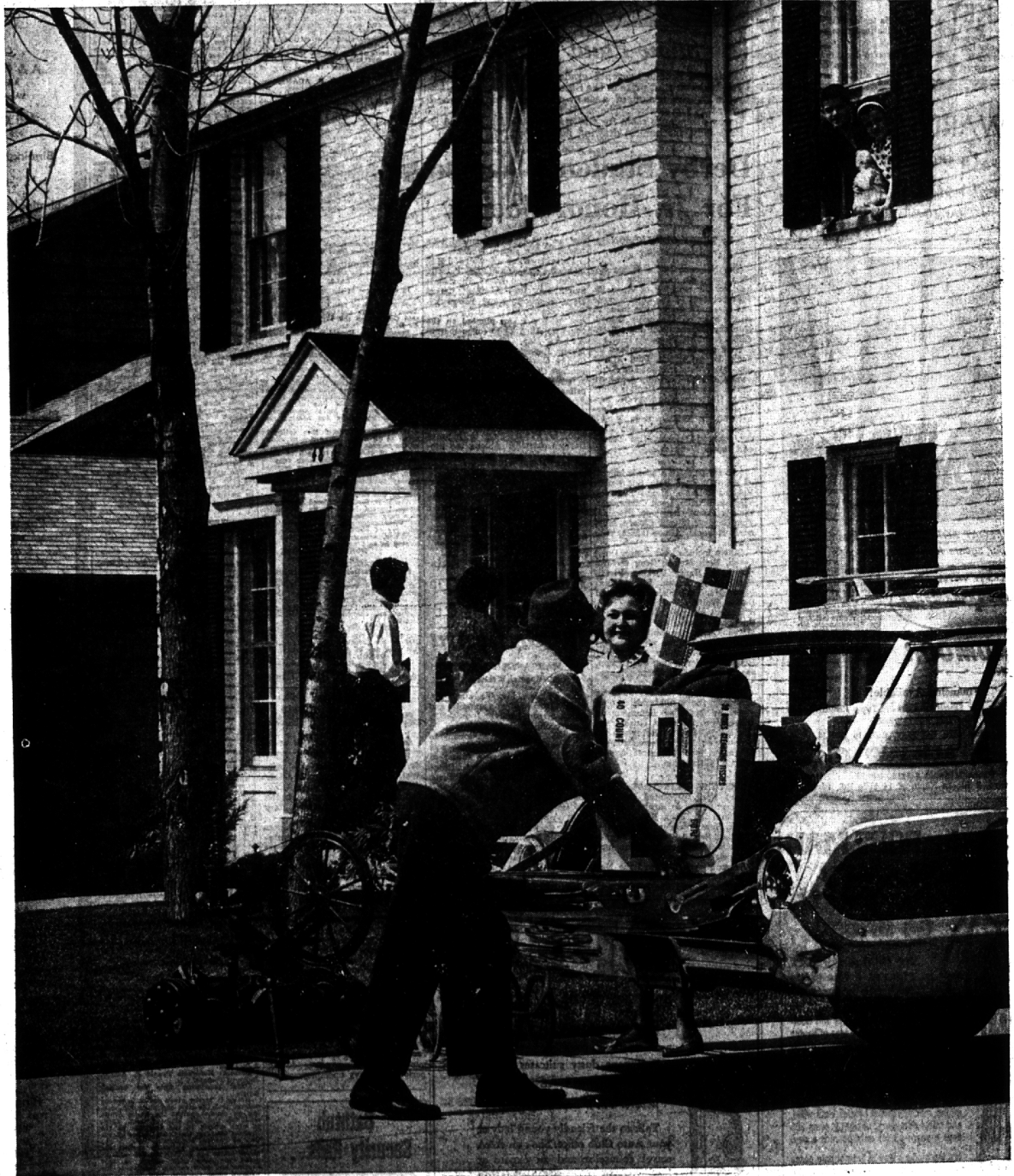
