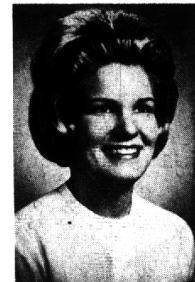
It's a Rough Pace

Rings on Their Fingers



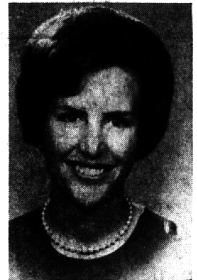

He did, though, and as a result, he and Ingerlise Christensen, whom he met while visiting in Stockholm, will be married May 16 in Copenhagen, where she lives.

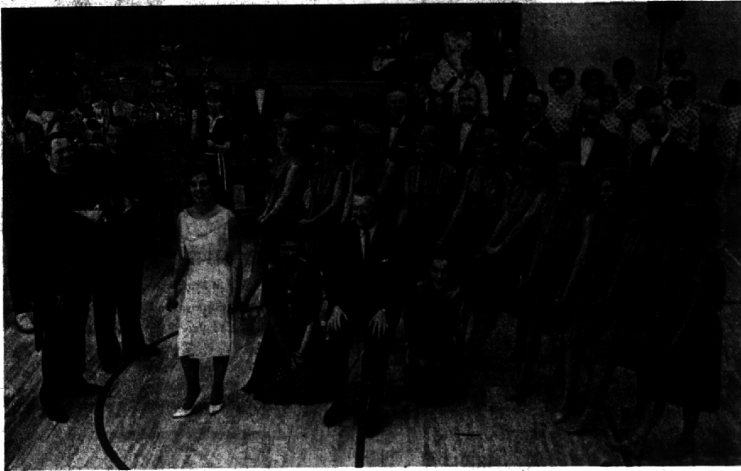
