

Birmingham Women Attend Conference

"Change Brings Challenge" was the overall theme of the Northeast-Central Regional Conference of the American Association of University Women which was held in Indianapolis, Ind., April 23 through 25.

Approximately one thousand college educated women from Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Ohio and Wisconsin attended sessions devoted to current and projected developments in the fields of science, education, family living and international affairs.

In announcing this 18th biennial conference of the five-state area, Mrs. George E. Bailey of Arlington Heights, Ill., AAUW vice-president for the Northeast-Central Region and conference program chairman, spoke of this year as one of transition within the AAUW organization. New areas of study were adopted last summer to provide a broader scope of study and action.

Region comprises the largest membership of the ten regions in AAUW. The organization has long pioneered in the area of educational opportunities for women. By recognizing colleges and universities which meet certain standards, by offering fellowships for graduate study, and by encouraging continuing education through study group organizations, AAUW has strengthened the educational position of women in the United States.
