Nearly 20 men, volunteers in the Southern Oakland Girl Scout Council, will be honored Wednesday evening, May 6, at the Council's 27th annual meeting at Southfield High School. Refreshments will be served in the cafeteria from 7 to 8 p.m. by Girl Scout units from the Southfield district.

The men to be honored have served the Council in various ways, giving their time freely and earning the devotion of the more numerous women volunteers. In fact, the Council could not survive without its men.
