Mrs. Vernon Butler was chairman of the event and Mrs. Alexander Houston was in charge of the fashion show presented by Don Thomas Sporthaus.

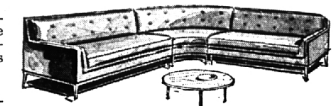
