GOP Official Raps Redistricting Bill

Charles L. Lyle, Oakland county chairman of the Republican Party, today called upon Gov. George Romney to veto the Lesinski redistricting bill, passed in the State Senate last Thursday with a coalition of 10 Democrat and 10 Republican senators.

If by some chance this bill should ever pass both Houses," Lyle said, "then I am asking the Governor to veto the bill at once. It is a terrible bill, dividing Oakland County into bits and pieces, and hanging parts of the county into 3 different Congressional districts. There is neither reason nor recommendation to it."

"In addition," Lyle continued, "it is three times as unfair as Governor Romney's bill, and has over three times as much population disparity as the bill the Governor suggests. Considering the point 'one man one vote' speaking of the Lesinski-Scholls favor, it would seem to us that if they are seriously interested in coming to this, they should welcome a bill like the Governor's that provides for a disparity of less than 5,000 votes from one district to another."
