

Reception at the BAA Opens Sculptors' Show

The 12th annual exhibition of the Terra Cotta Sculptors will open Sunday at the Bloomfield Art Association where a tea and reception will be held from 2 until 5 p.m. that day.

The Terra Cotta Sculptors organized as a club in 1952 among a group of Svea Kline's students. Their purpose has been to help

each member improve her skill and to further the appreciation of sculpture in the community.

Since that time, the group has met once a month, in each other's homes; they have made trips to the Racine Foundry and to various studios and exhibitions. The charter members of the club were Lilian Backus, Julie Brown, Janet

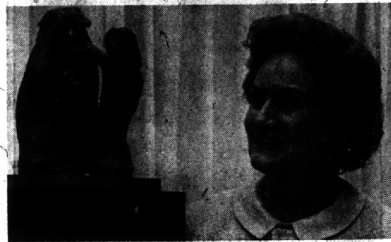

She is known in this area for her many commissions and for her sculpture classes in Birmingham and in Flint; each summer Miss Kline teaches sculpture at the Haystack School in Maine.

Another member of the Terra Cotta Sculptors, Olivette Moore, has appeared twice this year on television, demonstrating art techniques with her students in a Detroit elementary school.



MADelyn McNAUGHTON, who became a member of the Terra Cotta Sculptors in 1962, has been studying with Svea Kline for five years. Each summer she has attended the Haystack School in Maine where Miss Kline is the sculpture instructor. 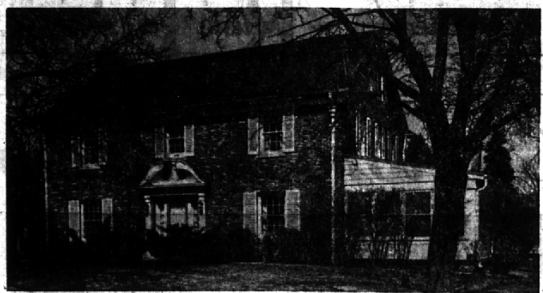

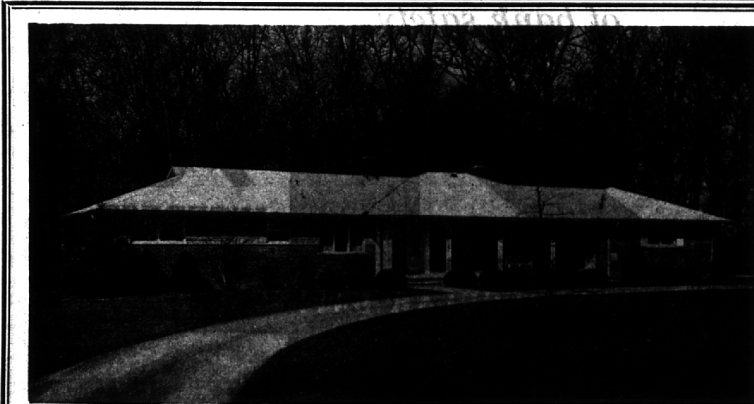

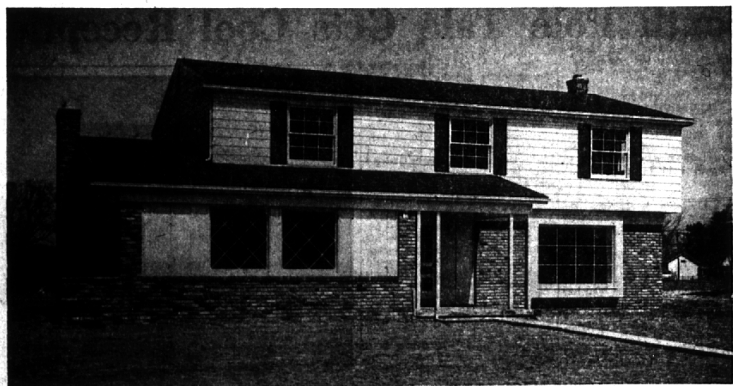
