If you played in Section C and remember this hand, did you find a way to get to a five spade contract, doubled?

It was an exciting hand and played to perfection.

Had West opened with the deuce of spades, they could have defeated the contract, but the king of hearts was led. Cipa won the first trick and led a small diamond toward the seven. East won this trick and made the best play by returning a trump.

Cipa was able to trump, two diamonds in the dummy which set up her king and enabled her to lose one diamond and one club to make this unusual contract—a hand well-bid and well-played and another first for Cipa and Ethel.

Birmingham Celebrates Family National Music Week

The 41st annual celebration of National Music Week, May 3-10, is being sponsored locally by the Birmingham Musicale, a member of the National Federation of Music Clubs.

Churches in Birmingham will present a massed choir festival, and there will be musical programs by school music departments including Seaholm and Groves and by the men's lunch clubs.

Baldwin Library will feature a table of books and records about music. Grinnell's and Smiley Brothers will spotlight National Music Week with window posters, and The Community House will have on view a poster with the mayor's proclamation.

National Music Week always begins the first Sunday in May and continues through Mother's Day.

"Make Music Your Keynote for Living."

Before his assassination, President John F. Kennedy had sent the federation the following message for 1964 National Music Week:

"America has during the course of its history encompassed a rich range of musical expression from the simple Beauty of our folk songs to the intricate excellence of our great symphony orchestras and opera companies.

"This musical heritage is being carried on and expanded by the interest and varied talents of all those who are today studying and performing music in school, at home, and on the stages of the world.

"National Music Week is a fitting celebration of the importance of music in American life."

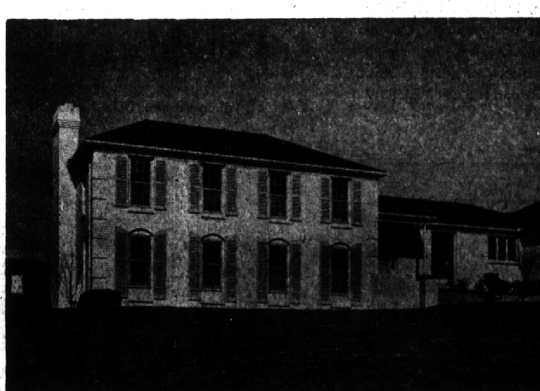
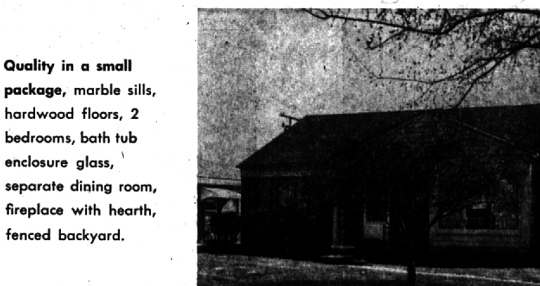
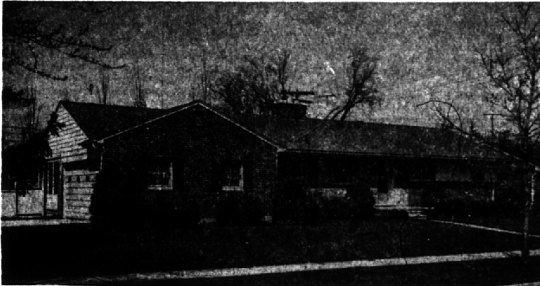
