Five speakers spoke to those present at the engineering panel held last week. Donald Frey of Ford Motor Company spoke on metallurgical and mechanical engineering. Civil and structural engineering was handled by Lawrence Mart, who is a member of the Michigan State Highway Department.

Detroit Edison was represented by William Pence. Pence spoke on the application of computers in the

field of engineering. Steven Plovan of General Motors had as his topic the scientific and chemical sides of engineering. Electrical engineering was covered by V. C. Wagner.

THE FUTURE panels will deal with the fields of the Law, education, medicine, business administration, and sales and administration.
