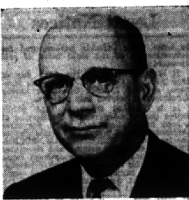

**Presbyterian Moderator at B'ham Church**

Dr. Silas G. Kessler, Moderator of the 175th General Assembly of the United Presbyterian Church, U. S. A., will occupy the pulpit of First Presbyterian Church on Sunday, May 10 while Dr. and Mrs. Harris are in Europe and the Holy Land.

Dr. Kessler has been pastor of the First United Presbyterian Church of Hastings, Neb. since 1940. Twelve young persons of his church have been ordained as ministers and five members of his church are now under care of Presbytery.

HE IS a graduate of the University of Dubuque and the Seminary of that school. A Trustee of Hastings College and a member of the Board of Christian Education and chairman of the Board's Counseling Committee on Higher Education, Dr. Kessler is a frequent speaker at preaching missions for colleges, military bases and for the Board of National Missions.

Moderator of both Presbytery and Synod, he has chaired numerous committees. Currently, he is chairman of Presbytery's Committee on Candidates, Synod's Committee on Realignment of Presbyteries and the Committee on Camps and Conferences. Dr. Kessler has served four terms on the Westminster Foundation Board.

Dr. Kessler recently toured several South American countries participating in the formation of a new Synod of Chile. At the inaugural meeting in Santiago, he presented a scroll given by the United Presbyterian Church through the Commission on Ecumenical Missions and Relations commemorating the event.

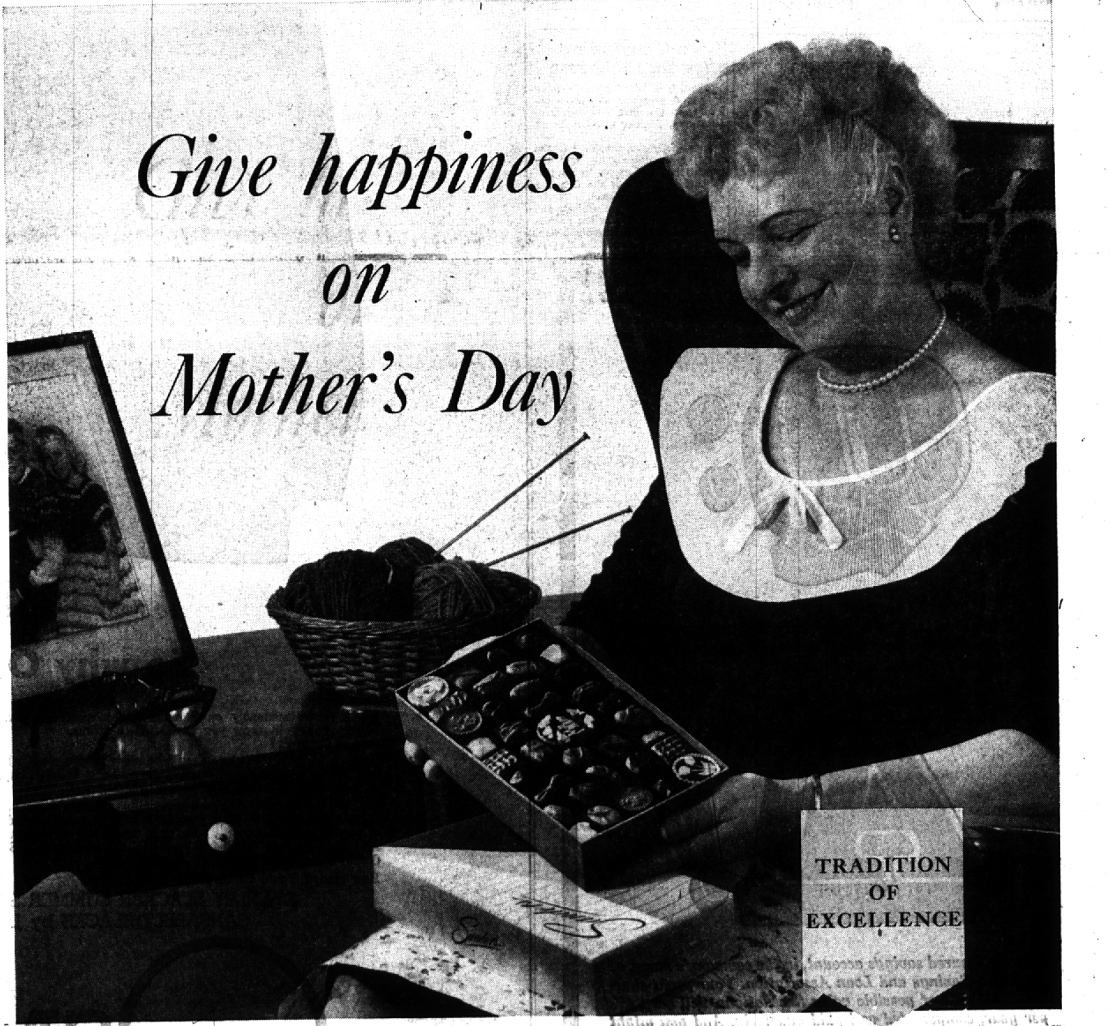

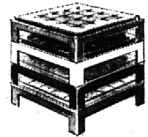
