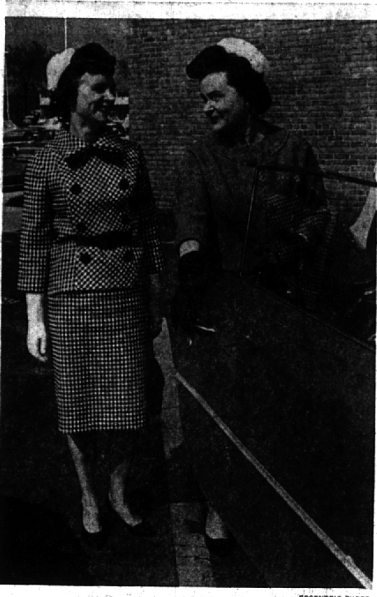
**TOP ENGINEERS**

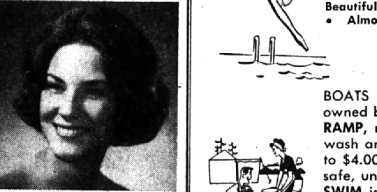
## Sharing the Wealth
