The Bloomfield Art Association tour of Italy, Greek Islands, Turkey, Switzerland, Germany and Holland which was enjoyed by many local residents has been completed.

Members of the BAA left Detroit March 30 and made their first stop in Rome. During the four days in Rome they visited the ruins, Tivoli and Hadrian's Villa. From Rome the tour went to Greece.

Highlighting the sightseeing in Athens were Corinth, Mycenae and Epidaurus. They toured the Greek Islands extensively, also exploring the ruins.

ON THE ISLAND of Santorin, the entire party participated in a donkey ride up the 600 steps to the top of the island which in itself was quite an unusual excursion.

Next stop on the itinerary was in Florence Italy. A delightful surprise was the invitation to visit the villa of Bernard Berenson just outside Florence. Berenson was an American art critic who graduated from Harvard University.

Upon his death four years ago the villa was left to Harvard University. He was an authority on Italian painting and considered one of the most notable art critics of his time.

Another special treat the tour group enjoyed was viewing the Bellini collection which was also by special invitation. A boat trip down the Rione was still another highlight of the trip.

Woman's Choices To Be Theme of Conference at OU

Is there enough for housewives to do when their children are in school or grown? Is housewifery technologically obsolete? If woman leaves the home, what is she going to do?

These are the questions that will be answered at an unusual conference for women called "Womans Choices in this Confusing Century," May 20 at Oakland University, Rochester, sponsored by the Division of Continuing Education.

Key features of the conference will be presentation of the opportunities open to women in Southeastern Michigan in 1964 by admission directors for four major universities, personnel and placement advisers representing business and industry, psychologists and psychiatrists.

They will present, respectively, the educational opportunities for those who must update or further their training; the opportunities for part-time, full-time and volunteer employment; and the problems women find in balancing the roles of wife, mother and worker in today's society.

A FOCAL point of the conference will be a part-time dialogue with Betty Friedman. Mrs. Friedman is author of the controversial book "The Feminine Mystique."

Over a direct telephone line to the conference Mrs. Friedman will give a short preview of her soon-to-be-published second book and then answer questions from the audience. Her voice and questions asked at portable microphones will be amplified so all participants can join in the dialogue.

The day will be divided into two sessions, with keynote speeches and the part-time dialogue in the morning for the total audience and small breakout sessions to answer specific questions in the afternoon.

Highlight of the event will be a preview exhibition of a famous and valuable new acquisition for the Detroit Institute of Arts collection.



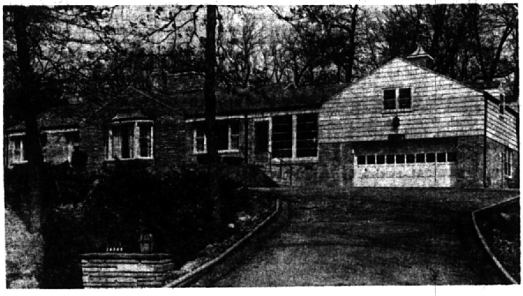
