Bloomfield Hills' golf team, a squad that has no practice facilities, knocked off Milford, 2-0, at the Hazel Park Golf Course on Tuesday. Bob Walters fired 39's on the par-37 course to lead the Barons to their fifth straight win.

In track, however, the Hills had a little trouble. Royal Oak Kimball captured its sixth win against two defeats downward the Barons, 60-49.

BOB RICHARDS of Bloomfield won the mile run in 4:24.7 and the Hills' mile relay team swept their event in 3:42. But Bloomfield only managed firsts in shot put and broad jump to go along with the others.

Other Laker wins came in the 100-yard dash with Vaughn McGraw and the 220, also by McGraw. The Laker mile relay team also won.

SOUTHFIELD was nosed out by Waterford, 57½ to 47½, in a track meet. The Jays also lost on the baseball field. Farmington's Steve Page tossed a two-hitter at Southfield in a 9-1 victory.
