B'ham Fireman Completes Course In Civil Defense

Joseph R. Sedano, 1821 Holland, Birmingham, who is a firefighter-dispatcher, city of Birmingham, has just completed a special civil defense course at the Department of Defense, Office of Civil Defense, Staff College in Battle Creek. This five-day course on radiological monitoring for instructors is one of several special courses offered by the OCD staff college and training centers.

THIS COURSE provides the technical background which is needed by the instructors who will be training monitors in the detection and reporting of radiological fallout. This defensive measure is an important part of the total national civil defense effort. The course also provides important training for assistant radiological defense officers who work in the various States and localities.

O-U Sets Telescope Building Workshop

Registration is being taken until May 15 for a telescope building workshop which will be held Monday and Tuesday evenings beginning June 15 at Oakland University, sponsored by the Division of Continuing Education. In the workshop, which is open to adults and teen-agers, students will actually build their own 4 1/2-inch reflecting telescopes. In supervised sessions they will learn the optical principles of the telescope, polish the mirror, assemble and mount the instrument. The eight-week course will end the week of August 8 with early evening viewing of stars, double stars, star clusters and Saturn. Tuition of \$80 includes costs of the telescope plus 48 hours of instruction.

Well Bid Awarded To Muskegon Firm

A \$3,000 contract for the construction of a well at the new golf course at Cranbrook and Lincoln was awarded to the Regier Water Well Drilling Co. of Muskegon by Birmingham city commissioners Monday night. City Engineer William T. Killen said the project calls for the installation of a 10-inch well as part of the sprinkler system for the new course. He said the well would be drilled adjacent to the pond and would discharge into the pond. Work under the contract will consist of drilling the well approximately 110 feet deep.

KILLEEN said in case an adequate water supply is not found at the pond the well would be drilled at a location north of the Bloomfield Art Association property. The Regier bid was about \$2,000 under the engineering department's estimate of cost.

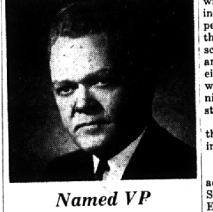
