**New Format, Features In Cranbrook's 'Opus'**

With the conclusion of this year's Foreign Affairs Seminar, a study of the present situation in Africa, the major subject has taken place before final exams.

The seniors have been given notice of college admissions and now they and the rest of the school must prepare themselves for the final push at the end of the year. Also, this week was important to Cranbrook as the literary scene. The "Opus," Cranbrook's literary magazine, appeared Tuesday amid a fanfare of posters and publicity.

THE "OPUS" has been a part of Cranbrook for 10 years, since its beginning as an experiment by the English Department. The first edition was a success, and, after several years of change and expansion, the Opus developed a standard format which was in use through 1963.

This year, however, the editors decided to again expand the popular magazine and have come forth with a completely new format in a new, solid binding, with twice the number of pages and student en-

tries that any previous "Opus" has ever had.

At first glance, the expansion seems to have been successful. Two hundred fifty copies were sold the first day off the press. The "Opus" will be available to visitors on the campus.

**Enrollment Slated For Kindergarten Pupils in Bloomfield**

Enrollments for kindergarteners for the school year 1964-65 will be taken in Booth, Conant, Eastover, Hickory Grove, Pine Lake, Vaughan and Wing Lake Schools during the week of May 25 through May 29. The hours of enrollment will be 9:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. and 1 p.m. to 3 p.m.
