### Valter Poole Scheduled At First Presbyterian

The annual Chancel Choir Recognition Dinner for the 85-member choir and their spouses will be held in the social hall of First Presbyterian Church on Tuesday evening, May 19 at 6:45 p.m.

Following the dinner, which is given by the church in recognition of service, there will be a presentation of awards by Royal Buchanan, chairman of the Music Council of the Church.

HE LATER studied for four years with Maurice Vieux, Professor of Viola at the Conservatory of Paris. The money for this valued training came from Poole's job as "hot trombones" with Leo Reisman's popular orchestra.

In addition to his orchestra activities, Poole is a professor of music on a full time basis at Wayne State University. During a year he conducts many performances of the Wayne Orchestra and Wayne Ensemble and gives advanced lecture courses at the University.
