**Draper Allen
To Speak at
Bethany W. Va.**

Draper Allen, public affairs leader and businessman of Birmingham, will present an address on James Beauchamp "Champ" Clark, at a special convocation today at Bethany College, W. Va. Honored guests for the convocation and a luncheon that noon will include Mrs. Genevieve Clark Thomson, of Balclutha, Berryville, Va., daughter of Champ Clark, and one of his grandsons and his wife, Mr. and Mrs. Kimball Clark of Arlington, Va. Clark, was a Bethany graduate of the class of 1873 and the Yearbook of the school was dedicated to him in 1912, the year he almost obtained the Democratic nomination for President.

A PORTRAIT of Clark, which was presented by him to the college, Allen has been donated in turn by him to the college. In addition, Allen has given the school a portrait of James Clark, U. S. President who was a Bethany trustee. This picture is a copy of the White House Portrait of Garfield. Allen, 2848 Northlawn, spoke at the college's 1963 convocation on Woodrow Wilson. While in the south, Allen, chairman of the newly formed Oakland County Board of Jury Commissioners, will also speak to the Charleston Rotary Club.

An improvement to be hereafter known as the 1964 ROAD OIL PROGRAM — LIGHT OIL consisting of grading the roadway and applying one application of asphaltic oil and stone chips to the following streets:

Creation of a Domestic Relations Division in the prosecutor's office was announced Monday by Richard P. Condit, Oakland County prosecuting attorney. Jack R. Baldwin, 1750 Hillwood, Bloomfield Hills, was promoted to assistant prosecutor in charge of the new division. He has been an assistant prosecutor since January, 1963. Condit said this division has been made necessary, "by increases in these five areas: "1. Nonsupport cases. "2. Dependent parent cases. "3. Paternity cases. "4. Reciprocal enforcement cases (non-support cases from out of the state)." "5. Cases involving waiver of jurisdiction of minors from circuit to juvenile court (those involving divorce action)." BALDWIN WILL be assisted by G. Edson Hallock and a clerical staff of four. Condit also announced that Daniel C. Devine, 16121 Lauderdale, Beverly Hills, is being transferred from the Pontiac office to the Royal Oak office to assist William Lang, assistant prosecutor in charge of that office. Montague R. Hunt is being transferred from Royal Oak to Pontiac to try major felony cases.
