## Appointments, Promotions

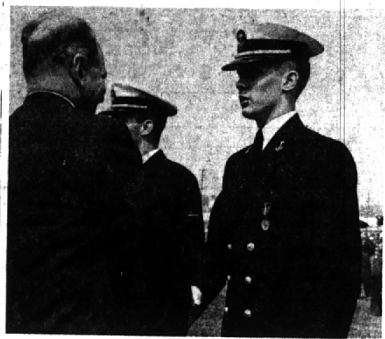

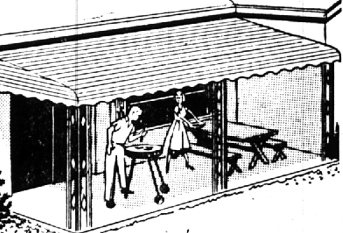
