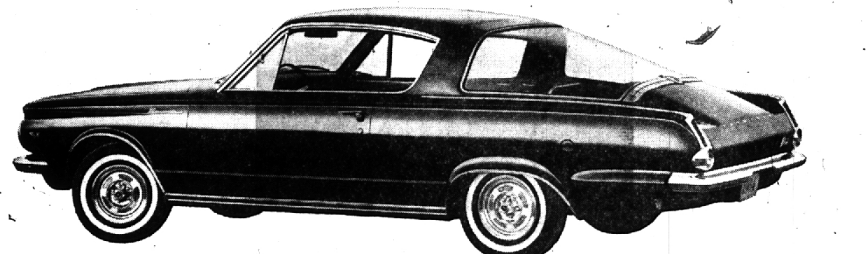

Completing a wonderful day, the Webelos will share in a barbecue dinner and campfire.

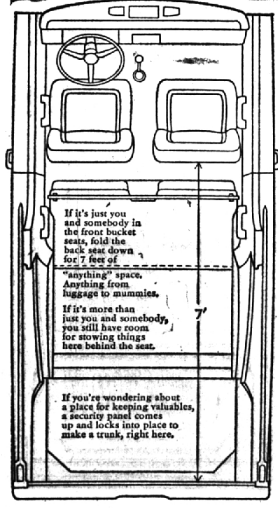
