serve historical material relating to the history of the Northwest Territory and the city of Birmingham.

The board would also be made the legal custodian of all the documents, books, records or papers it collected or was given.

WITH THE consent of the commission the board would have the power to accept donations of money, personal property or real estate for historical purposes.

Commissioners are expected to act on the ordinance within the next two weeks. In discussing the historical ordinance, Commissioner Carl F. Ingraham suggested the City also look into the possibility of establishing a fine arts commission. A similar proposal was rejected by the commission two years ago.

and senior lifesaving) of approximately six weeks duration, not including week ends or holidays.

WICHERT ALSO outlined his recommendations for waterfront development:

Waterfront equipment would be at a minimum but of substantial, modern, approved fixtures. Fencing would be used to enclose the waterfront (220 feet by 80 feet) only, which would control the area when not in use.

The boundary of the school property would be marked clearly near the waterfront (approximately 350 feet back from the lake) to insure the rights of neighbors.

At no time will motor boats be permitted on the lake as part of the school program," said Wichert. "It will be our endeavor to run a well-organized, supervised aquatics program."

WICHERT SAID "the biggest fallacy in the implication some people are trying to make that the facility would be a public beach—when it would not."

"I feel that it would merely be an extension of classroom instruction," he added. School officials say that the beach program was proposed in an effort to solve the district's lack of swimming facilities.

Voters, who have turned down bond issues for swimming pools three times in the past, will decide the fate of a similar \$550,000 proposal on June 8.
