Many of the bridge experts believe that the real science of bridge is in the defense. Our hand for today is a good example of the case that may be exerted to defeat a contract. This particular hand made three no trumps at most tables. The defense that defeated this contract was worked out by Sue Bodary and Lynn Westhoven, and you will notice that most every week their names appear as winners. This hand is a very good reason for their continual success. Neither Vulnerable: Dealer North.

The bidding:
 NORTH EAST SOUTH WEST
 1 ♠ pass 2 NT pass

 Opening lead: 8 ♦

The declarer went up with the 10 of diamonds in the dummy which held the first trick, then led the king of clubs. Sue carefully played the four of diamonds, and when the next lead from dummy was the 10 of clubs, that Lynn covered with the Jack and won in the closed hand with the ace. Sue was careful to discard the deuce of hearts.

When Lynn gained the lead with the queen of clubs, he knew that his partner wanted a spade lead, which was made, and the contract defeated. Had Lynn made the usual play of the ten of hearts, South would have his nine tricks and the contract fulfilled.

Sue, by her discards, showed Lynn the easy way to defeat this contract. This was a message by West that didn't need a cryptographer to decipher. This is the way to winning bridge.

MSU Center Offers Course In Playmaking

Michigan State University Graduate Center in cooperation with the department of continuing education, Oakland University, announces the offering of a new and different approach to dramatics at the 1964 summer session. A course carrying graduate credit, in which the principles of playmaking for children will be explored, is being planned on the Oakland campus beginning June 23. This course will be taught by Dr. William Gregory of the Vanguard Theatre in Detroit.

TEACHERS WILL BE required to complete written observations of the work with children and make a file of stories suitable for dramatization and prepare an outline for a proposed creative dramatics program for a particular age group. Fourth, fifth and sixth grade children will be used as subjects. Classes will be held Tuesday and Thursday from 2 to 4:30 p.m. for six weeks. Registration can be made at the MSU graduate office at Oakland University, either in advance or at the regular registration period 8 a.m.-8 p.m. July 17, 18 and 19.
