Cranbrook School has been officially notified that three seniors, Guy Bramble, Dave Weideman and Larry Schiller, will be invited to attend British schools in England next year under grants from the International Schoolboy Fellowship, sponsored by the English Speaking Union.

This selection of students was made by a committee of six, of which assistant-headmaster Mr. Ben Snyder was a member.

SOON WE will receive word from a companion group in England, who will decide what schools the boys will attend. The committee tries to match each boy with an institution where his abilities will be most useful.

There are 28 participating schools in the program, although not all of these participate in the exchange each year. Six schools besides Cranbrook are sending three boys abroad this year: Western Reserve, Andover, Woodbury Forest, Hill School, Mr. Herman and Lawrenceville.

Cranbrook has participated in the past, but this is our first year to have three qualify, the maximum allowable under present rules.

ANOTHER related program, sponsored by the Michigan Council of Churches, will send three Cranbrook juniors to Europe on an exchange basis during the summer.

Dick Gradolph will travel to Finland, Chris Grikshiet to The Netherlands and Dick Moon will go to Germany. Each boy will live for two months with a European family and should find his visit extremely rewarding.
