Eleanor, a senior English major, led a select group of 14 young women from Mills College who comprised the delegation from the African nation of Ghana at the M.U.N. session held in Spokane, Washington. Over 1000 students from 105 colleges and universities attended the four-day meeting, enacting the procedures and debating the issues of the United Nations in New York.

During the current academic year Eleanor, as chairman of Model United Nations at Mills, has organized and directed a special training program at the college, including extensive research on the United Nations and Ghana, in preparation for this M.U.N. conference.

ACTIVE IN VARIOUS campus affairs, Eleanor has served for two years as a member of the editorial board of the literary magazine at Mills. She has been a leader in arts commission at the California women's college, and in line with her interest in international relations, served

this year as editor of the Mills World Affairs Conference publication, a handbook of bibliographical data, supplementing lectures by prominent speakers on issues of timely importance.

Eleanor's Model United Nations activities have included her participation as a delegate in part of the annual conference of Model United Nations of the Far West, and her vice-chairmanship of the group at Mills, prior to her present post as chairman.
