Lamp Shade Wrap Isn't News-worthy

High on the list of moving-day packing "don'ts" concerns the use of newspaper as a wrapping material for lamp shades.

Packing experts point out that newspaper ink is apt to rub off onto the shade and leave a permanent stain.

Either let the mover pack the shade into a special tissue-lined carton or, if you're doing your own packing, use several layers of white tissue around the outside and inside of the shade before using newspaper as the outer wrapping.
