Wing Lake Rd. Home Enhanced by Orchards

The home at 7100 Wing Lake road was built in 1856. It stood among orchards—peach, apple and pear, on land granted to Joseph Barkley in 1825.
It was the family home of Homer Case, Bloomfield Township supervisor. His grandfather, Jesse Case, purchased the property in 1862.
Case's grandmother was Viola Durkee, daughter of Wilkes Durkee, who owned the land now known as Birmingham Farms. His father purchased the property in 1909, and Case recalls the difficulty in getting peaches to market in Detroit each day with horse and wagon.
His FATHER purchased a truck in 1913, one of the first in the area. Telegraph and Northwestern Highway did not exist then.
Mr. and Mrs. James C. Hiden and family have lived here since September, 1963.
