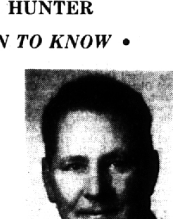
Bloomfield Surf Club Prepares For 1964 Season

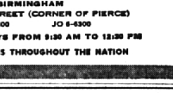

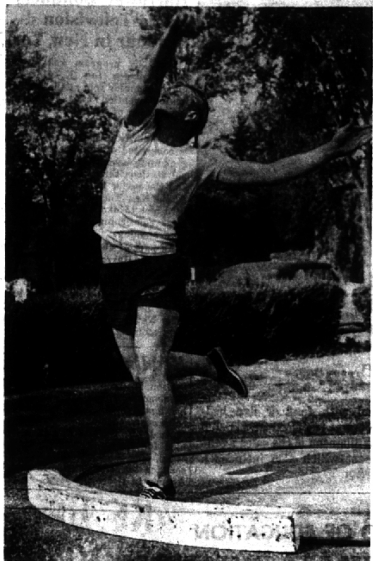
