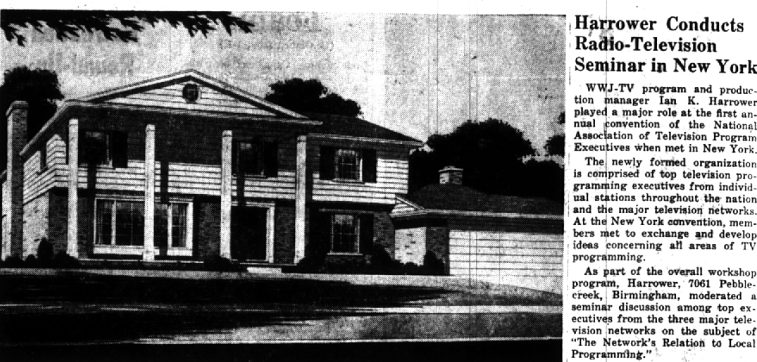

GENERAL BONDING PROPOSITION Shall Bloomfield Hills School District No. 2, County of Oakland, Michigan, borrow the sum of not exceeding Seven Million Forty-Five Thousand (\$7,045,000.00) Dollars and issue its bonds therefor for the purpose of erecting, furnishing and equipping new school buildings, including two new elementary schools, a new junior high school, a new senior high school and new facilities for administration and buses...

II. PHYSICAL EDUCATION BONDING PROPOSITION Shall Bloomfield Hills School District No. 2, County of Oakland, Michigan, borrow the sum of not exceeding Six Hundred Twenty-Five Thousand (\$625,000.00) Dollars and issue its bonds therefor for the purpose of erecting, furnishing and equipping a swimming pool, a tennis court, a new gymnasium, together with the necessary building or addition to house the same, in said School District, as well as five tennis courts, lighting and a running track at each of the two existing junior high schools, and extension of tennis facilities to five courts, with lighting, at the existing senior high school?

Each person voting on the above bonding propositions must be: (a) a citizen of the United States of America over twenty-one (21) years of age; (b) a resident of the State of Michigan for six (6) months and in the School District for thirty (30) days prior to the date of the election; (c) the owner of property assessed for taxes within the School District, or the lawful husband or wife of such owner; (d) A registered elector in the city or township in which he resides.
