Plan Board Rejects Newell Zoning Plea

The Birmingham Plan Board Tuesday night turned down a rezoning by a property owner to rezone his land from R-1 to R-2.

By a unanimous vote the board denied a petition of Frank Newell to rezone his 60,000-square-foot lot on the northeast corner of Waterfall Lane and W. Maple.

City Planner William R. Brownfield said the petitioner had been trying to get the property rezoned to various classifications since 1947.

He said the city recently won a court case against having the land rezoned to multiple use.

Despite Brownfield's recommendation that the land be rezoned to R-2, the board rejected the request on the basis that it could be developed in an R-1 manner.

OTHER PROPERTY owners in the area objected to the fact that eight units could be constructed under the R-2 zoning classification.

Under R-1 five or six units could be placed on the property.

In other action the planning board tabled for two weeks a request by the Birmingham Board of Education to close Oakland Avenue between Adams and Worth on a permanent basis.

Asst. Supt. Norman A. Wolfe said the school board was interested in closing the street to provide safe access to the playground of the Adams School.

At the present time the street is closed from 7:30 a.m. until 4 p.m. on school days. The permanent closing would permit the school's to develop and landscape the area leading to the playground.

WOLFE SAID the schools were not interested in constructing either an overpass or a tunnel to provide access to the playground.

The delay was granted by the plan board to allow the schools and city administration time to look into the possibility of finding alternate routes for traffic if Oakland ward were to be closed.

The board also voted to pass on to city commissioners the final phase of the comprehensive plan.

The last phase of the two-year study is a development plan to provide a guide to the future development of the city.

Commissioners and plan board members are expected to discuss the plan at a joint meeting of the two groups in the near future.
