will be presented to the graduates and Certificates to all other Beth Haysel students.

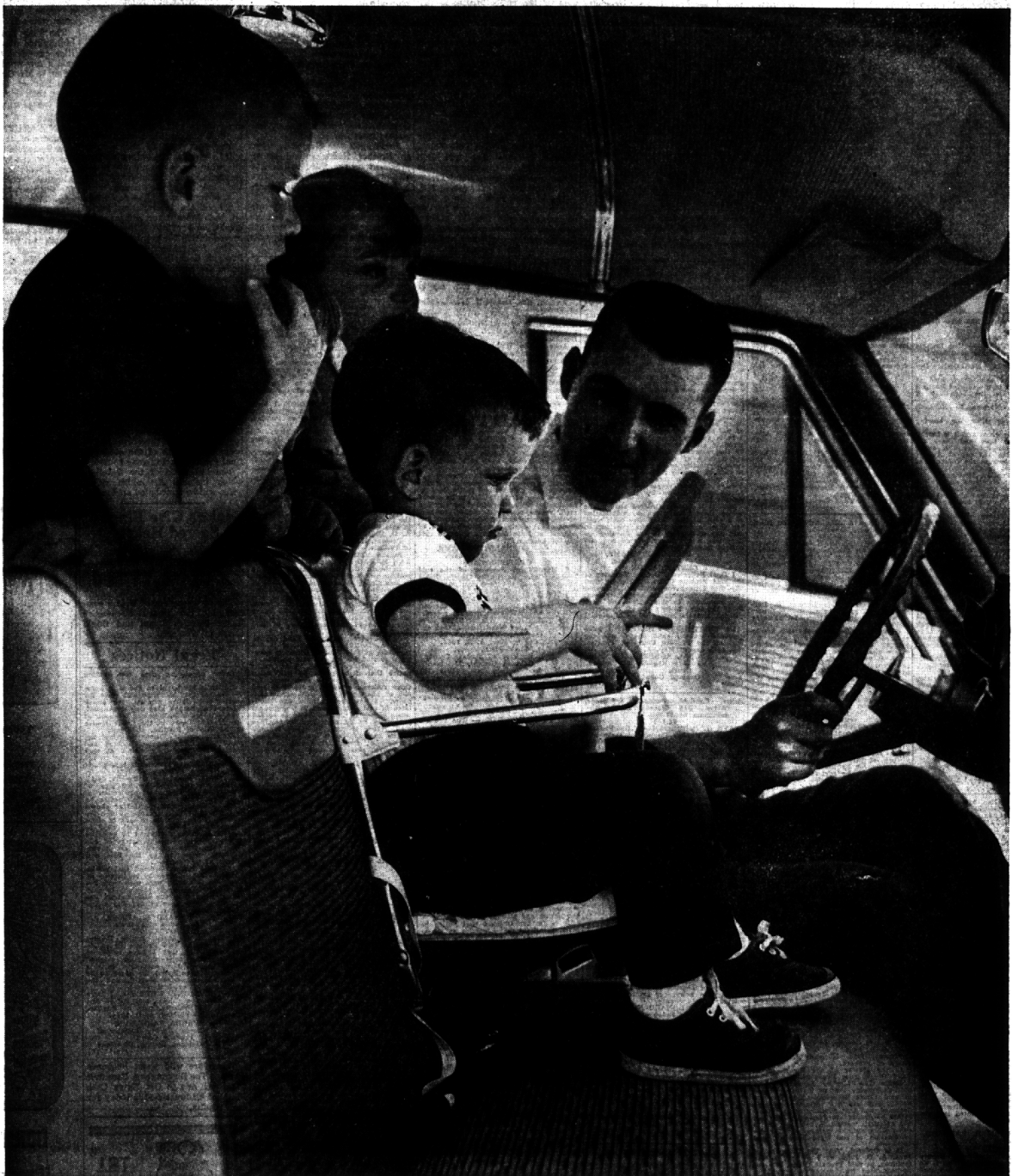
