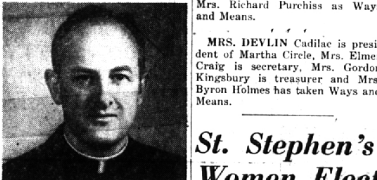
Lathrup Congregational Church Sets Officers
