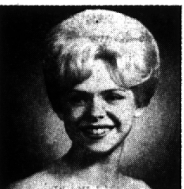

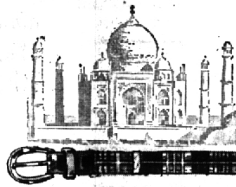


**Looking Ahead**

**Libri Club**

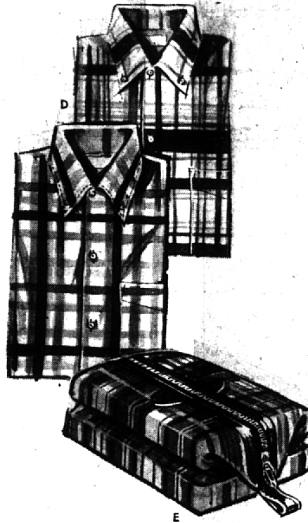

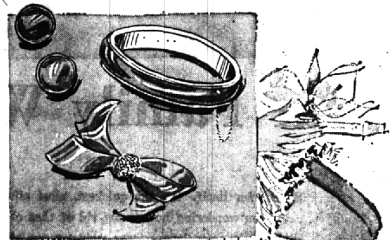
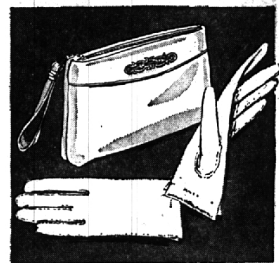
