Generally, members study and participate in demonstration groups in all eleven phases of parliamentary law which they might experience in the group they represent, such as women's clubs, PTA meetings, city commission and school board meetings and all other occasions where a knowledge of the correct procedure is necessary.

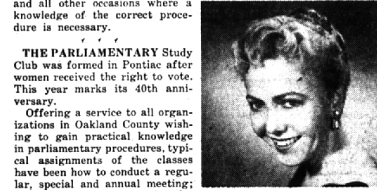
Offering a service to all organizations in Oakland County wishing to gain practical knowledge in parliamentary procedures, typical assignments of the classes have been how to conduct a regular, special and annual meeting; how to hold a mass meeting for the purpose of organizing a society; adoption of a constitution; amending constitution and by-laws; formalities in making a motion; duties of officers and the demonstration of all other formalities necessary in club work.

Meetings are held in the Masonic Temple in Pontiac on the first and third Wednesday beginning in October through March.

THE OFFICERS of the demonstration group are changed every other meeting so that a member may obtain practical knowledge and experience in the various club offices lying within her scope of interest.
