Pick County Sixth Graders Prepare For City 'Septathlon'

The 16 elementary schools of the Birmingham Board of Education have completed trials for the All-City "Septathlon."

The annual meet, scheduled for tomorrow night at 7 p.m. at Senholm's field, is the largest athletic event sponsored by the Birmingham Public Schools.

Approximately 480 boys and girls are expected to be entered in this year's meet. The "Septathlon" is limited to only sixth grade winners in seven events.

FIELD DAY activities at each of the schools during the last two weeks served as the trials for the All-City competition.

The seven events that make up the "Septathlon" are tug-of-war, high jump, broad jump, softball throw, triple jump, 50-yard dash and 500-yard shuttle run.

Boys and girls will compete separately in all events with the exception of the tug-of-war and shuttle relay. Only first-place awards will be presented in the latter two.

In case of inclement weather, the meet will be held Monday at 7 p.m. at the Senholm field.

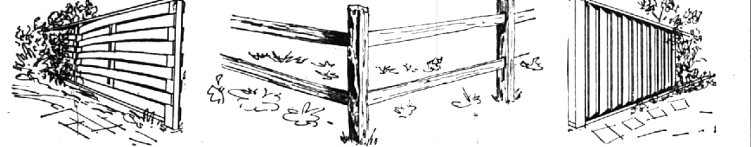

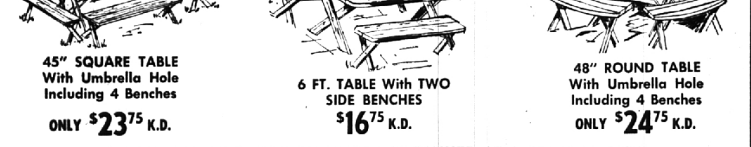

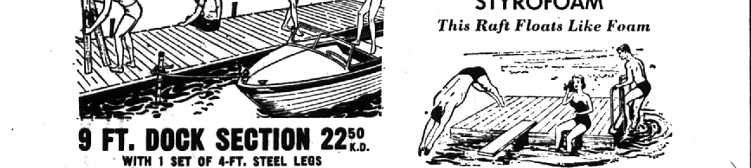
