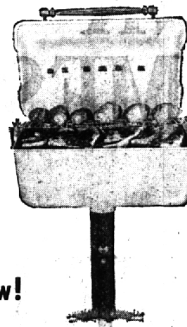
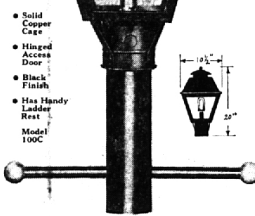

Hannin will explain how the inter-county group in southeastern Michigan was formed, its goals and achievements that were made possible by inter-governmental cooperation between counties and municipalities within the counties.

**I. GENERAL BONDING PROPOSITION**

Shall Bloomfield Hills School District No. 2, County of Oakland, Michigan, borrow the sum of not exceeding Seven Million Forty-Five Thousand (\$7,045,000.00) Dollars and issue its bonds therefor for the purpose of erecting, furnishing and equipping new school buildings, including two new elementary schools, a new junior high school, a new senior high school and new facilities for school administration and buses; erecting, furnishing and equipping additions to existing school buildings; making and improving existing school buildings and sites; and acquiring additional school sites in said School District?

**II. PHYSICAL EDUCATION BONDING PROPOSITION**

Shall Bloomfield Hills School District No. 2, County of Oakland, Michigan, borrow the sum of not exceeding Six Hundred Twenty-Five Thousand (\$625,000.00) Dollars and issue its bonds therefor for the purpose of erecting, furnishing and equipping a swimming pool and appurtenant facilities, together with the necessary building or addition to house the same in said School District and also to erect, furnish, light and equip a running track at each of the two existing junior high schools, and extension of tennis facilities to five courts, with lighting, at an existing senior high school?

Each person voting on the above bonding propositions must be: (a) A citizen of the United States of America over twenty-one (21) years of age; (b) A resident of the State of Michigan for six (6) months immediately preceding the election; and (c) The owner of property assessed for taxes within the School District, or the lawful husband or wife of such owner; (d) A registered elector in the city or township in which he resides.

TAKE NOTICE that the Board of Education has estimated the expense of making improvements listed in Bonding Proposition I above to be Seven Million Forty-Five Thousand (\$7,045,000.00) Dollars, and the expense of making improvements listed in Bonding Proposition II above to be Six Hundred Twenty-Five Thousand (\$625,000.00) Dollars, all of which is necessary to raise by borrowing and issuing bonds of the District. **COMMUNITY COLLEGE QUESTION**

to vote upon the establishment and operation of a Community College provided by Act 188 of 1955 as amended, in a Community College District consisting of the territory designated by the Board of Education of Oakland County School District, excepting therefrom the corporate territory of the Clarensville School District and set forth in the following propositions, and the authorization of a maximum tax rate for the Community College District, and authorized by resolutions of the Board of Education of Oakland Schools dated March 28, 1964 and May 7, 1964 under the following propositions and questions:

**STATEMENT OF PURPOSE OF ELECTION**

THE PURPOSES of the election are to authorize the establishment and operation of a Community College to provide collegiate and non-collegiate level and vocational-technical education, and the acquisition, construction, ownership, development and maintenance of facilities of the Community College, and to authorize the levy of taxes by the Board of Education of the Community College District for the support of the Community College in an amount not to exceed a maximum annual rate, and to elect a Board of Trustees of the Community College District, all as provided by Act 188 of 1955, as amended.

**COMMUNITY COLLEGE PROPOSITION**

SHALL Act 188 of the Public Acts of 1955, as amended, being Sections 390.871 and following of the Compiled Laws of 1948, be adopted as the law of the Community College District of Parts of the Counties of Oakland, Washtenaw, Livingston and Lapeer, comprised of the territory of Oakland Schools, an Intermediate School District, excepting therefrom the corporate territory of the Clarensville School District of Oakland and Wayne Counties, and excepting

**MAXIMUM TAX RATE PROPOSITION**

SHALL the Board of Trustees of the Community College District of Parts of the Counties of Oakland, Washtenaw, Livingston and Lapeer, State of Michigan, comprised of the territory of Oakland Schools, an Intermediate School District, excepting therefrom the corporate territory of the Clarensville School District of Oakland and Wayne Counties, and excepting therefrom those parts of the corporate territory of the Rochester Community School District lying within the corporate territory of the County of Macomb, and consisting of the corporate territories of the School Districts of Avondale School District, Berkeley City School District, Birmingham City Schools, Bloomfield Hills School District, Brandon School District, Clarkson Community Schools, Clawson City School District, Dublin School District, Farmington Public School District, Ferndale City School District, Hazel Park City School District, Holly Area School District, Huron Valley School District, Lake Orion Community School District, Lamphere Public Schools, South Lyon Community Schools, Madison School District, North Oxford School District, Novi Community School District, Oak Park School District, Oxford Area Community School District, Pontiac City School District, Rochester Community School District excepting therefrom those parts of the corporate territory of the Rochester Community School District lying within the corporate territory of the County of Macomb, North Oxford School District, Walled Lake Consolidated School District, Waterford Township School District and West Bloomfield School District, be authorized to levy a tax on the real and tangible personal property within the district at the maximum annual rate of one mill on \$1,000 of the equalized assessed valuation of the property within the district, in the manner and for the purposes provided by Act 188 of 1955, as amended?

**MAXIMUM TAX RATE QUESTION**

SHALL the Board of Trustees of the Community College District of Parts of the Counties of Oakland, Washtenaw, Livingston and Lapeer be authorized to levy a tax on the real and tangible personal property within the district at the maximum annual rate of one mill on each dollar (\$1.00 per \$100.00) of the equalized assessed valuation of the property within the district, in the manner and for the purposes provided by Act 188 of 1955, as amended?
